Pioneer Heritage Festival of the Ozarks - Exhibitor Application - Page 2 - Guidelines

Exhibitor Cost, Approval, and Deadlines: There is no set-up fee for exhibitors, but you must be willing to demonstrate/talk about your heritage skills with festival goers. You may sell only hand-crafted items which are related to your heritage skills and which you made yourself. PHFO reserves all rights pertaining to the approval or rejection of exhibitor applications for participation in the festival. We ask that you submit your application as soon as possible and promptly notify us if you cannot attend.

Exhibitor Insurance: Festival insurance does not cover loss, theft of or damage to your items. It is recommended that exhibitors have their own insurance. PHFO will not be liable for loss, theft or damage to your items.

Exhibitor space size, location, electricity and fire: PHFO will locate your space in specific areas with like participants. A regular booth space is approx. 10 x 10 ft. If you believe you will need more space, please note this on your application and we will attempt to accommodate your needs as space allows. If your exhibit involves fire, you must notify us when submitting your application and obtain pre-approval from PHFO. In general, electrical outlets are not available for exhibits. Generators are not allowed.

Additional needs: Please let us know if you might have any other specific needs/requests for the success of your exhibit when you submit your application. These requests will be evaluated on an individual basis. Our festival committee will work to accommodate as many requests as possible, but we cannot guarantee this. Approval will be noted with your space confirmation.

Dress: We ask that exhibitors dress in a style that would be typical for people living in the rural Ozarks in the 19th and early 20th centuries. This can be plain and simple (for example, farmer's clothes with straw hats) or "fancy period dress" as you like. Our aim isn't to enforce a strict dress code, but to present an image consistent with our heritage theme while adding to the festivities. Make it fun!

Responsibility: We ask that all festival participants be respectful of others and our venue. You agree to direct any problems immediately to festival staff for resolution. Decisions of festival staff in resolving issues at the festival will be considered final.

Set-up/Break-down: You should arrive and begin to set up **at least two hours prior to gate opening**, with set up completed 30 minutes prior to gate opening, with vehicles removed to the parking area. No participant will begin packing up their area before the end of the festival on Saturday unless given prior approval.

Cancellation of space: Out of courtesy to PHFO, please notify us at least 24 hours prior to the festival opening if you cannot show. This will allow your space to be re-assigned.
